a Thug Life. The good old days may feel a bit sticky right now, depending on how tight you're holding on to the past. Go ahead, just try to get it off you.

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Don't have any "black friends"? Feeling a little dissonance? Take a look around the office, and no, the guy in IT doesn't count. Scroll through your contacts, tap into your network or reach out to HR.

Time for a survey or a focus group? Call a meeting, grab the white board and colored markers. Host a learning lunch, a half-day workshop with half sandwiches, or a weekend revisioning retreat with team t-shirts, ball caps,

yoga mats and tote bags. Perhaps it's time to think about hiring a Black consultant.

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If you're an established corporation with a profound appreciation for Black Americana, the time has come to say good-bye to your smiling black friends. You can't work that wholesome Underground Railroad angle forever. Stop

Photoshopping your logo. Swapping the head scarf for a soft perm and pearls won't make her look timeless. Deleting a butler's bow-tie just calls attention to all that PC nonsense. A white-collared Uncle Ben will never look like Barack

Obama, and light Aunt Jemima still looks like Auntie-Blackness. It's hard, letting go. Unless it's fixed to your head, a brown face is still blackface, no matter how you render it. Say you're sorry. Say they matter. Call it a learning experience.
